


















## Addendum to financing agreement between the Government of Denmark and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP)

<p><b>Key results:</b> - Distribution of humanitarian assistance to vulnerable children and their families in humanitarian crises globally.</p> <p><b>Justification for support:</b></p> <p>UNICEF's humanitarian warehouse in Denmark contributes to the organization's daily distribution of humanitarian assistance to vulnerable children and their families in humanitarian crises globally.</p> <p>UNICEF have had an increased need for warehouse capacity, since the covid-19 pandemic. Since 2020, UNICEF has rented temporary warehouse capacity in Taastrup, which has been covered by the Danish MFA. The additional contribution is within the frames of the existing agreement 2023 regarding the UN-City Copenhagen signed with UNDP.</p> <p>The additional contribution will cover the finance gap for rent of the temporary warehouse in 2023. The rent is DKK 25 mio., where the existing agreement includes DKK 14,7 mio.</p> <p>The costs for the temporary warehouse facility is included in the finance act for 2024.</p> <p><b>Risk</b> The commitment entails no significant risks.</p>	<b>File No.</b>	23/26673

### Strategic objectives

UNICEF's humanitarian warehouse in Denmark contributes to the organization's daily distribution of humanitarian relief to vulnerable children and their families in humanitarian crises globally.

### Justification for choice of partner:

UNICEF's mandate and experience with humanitarian assistance to vulnerable children and their families in crises globally from the humanitarian warehouse located in Denmark since 1962.

### Summary:

Denmark has hosted UNICEF's humanitarian warehouse since 1962. Today the warehouse is the world's largest humanitarian warehouse with daily humanitarian assistance to vulnerable children and their families in humanitarian crises. The humanitarian storage in Copenhagen has 850 different commodities and provide humanitarian assistance to the World's humanitarian crises such as in Ukraine, Afghanistan and the Horn of Africa. Since 2020, UNICEF has experienced challenges with insufficient capacity and thus have rented temporary warehouse capacity in Taastrup, which has been covered by the Danish MFA (25 mio. DKK annually).
