Annex G Level 2 Project Selection and Evaluation Scoring

Selection criteria

The large portfolio of 725 funded projects and the practical limitations imposed by the Evaluation's mandate has meant that only a small proportion of the total projects can be evaluated.

The list of 38 projects with 36 grantees was selected from a list of grant funded projects with limited information relating to grant amount, location, sector and sub-sector and phase using the following process:

- plans to interview in three locations, Tamale in the North Zone, Kumasi for the Central Zone and Accra (and Tema) for the Coastal Zone
- at least one project was sought from each region in Ghana outside of the interview locations
- projects were divided into large, medium and small, based on the grant size of GHS 100,000+; GHS 25,000-100,000; and smaller than GHS 25,000 with projects selected in each subdivision, but with a bias on large projects so that the selection represented a significant grant spend
- a balance was sought between industry, services and agriculture sectors
- at least one project was sought from economic sub-sectors with significant advocacy action, defined as sub-sectors which BUSAC funded 10 or more projects, on the basis that the issues in these sectors were considered important for change
- at least one project dealt primarily with minority or women's issues, although gender issues would be looked at for all projects
- a reasonable balance between phase 1 and phase 2 projects
- a distinction is drawn between largely Accra-based organisations dealing with national issues and more local advocacy initiatives.

A random selection was made in accordance with the process outlined above based first on size, then location, then sector. The resulting selection was scrutinised to determine sub-sectoral balance and minor adjustments were made to the selection to improve the outcome for the other desired criteria. Statistics relating to the selection outcome in relation to the criteria is also provided below.

The selected portfolio has the characteristics shown in Table 1 compared to the overall BUSAC portfolio:

- Projects are largely relevant to BUSAC and Ghana private sector development agendas. A number of projects appear to have little economic additionality however.
- Projects have invariably been run efficiently, and in line with the BUSAC advocacy capacity building model.
- Projects have been largely effective in providing access to duty bearers and increasing capacity of organisations to advocate in accordance with the BUSAC advocacy model.
- Results have been mixed, for a variety of reasons, but almost half of projects reviewed are yet to
 achieve results, representing a mixture of lack of funding to implement agreements and the long
 period required to achieve objectives.
- The sustainability marks for this portfolio is higher than it would have been for a non-weighted portfolio. The weighting favoured national level projects and advocates.
