

CIRCULAR NOTE

**Information on the availability of reserved
parking spaces in central Copenhagen**

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Protocol Department, presents its compliments to all Heads of Diplomatic Missions and Consulates accredited to and resident in Denmark, Heads of International Organisations and other Missions resident in Copenhagen, and has the honour to inform of developments affecting the availability of reserved parking spaces for diplomatic missions in central Copenhagen.

The number of reserved parking spaces in central Copenhagen, and particularly in the historical city centre (see attached map), is decreasing. This is primarily due to ongoing and planned urban development in the area, including the removal of public parking spaces and the creation of new pedestrian streets and public spaces. As a result, there are fewer public parking spaces available that can potentially be converted into reserved parking spaces for diplomatic missions.

Applications to Copenhagen Municipality for reserved parking spaces will continue to be considered on a case-by-case basis. However, it is to become increasingly difficult for Copenhagen Municipality to accommodate requests for new reserved parking spaces in central Copenhagen, particularly in the historical centre.

The Ministry encourages diplomatic missions to consider these circumstances when considering establishment of new or relocation of existing premises to this part of Copenhagen.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark, Protocol Department, avails itself of this opportunity to renew to all Heads of Diplomatic Missions and Consulates accredited to Denmark, International Organisations and Other Missions resident in Copenhagen and Honorary Consulates in Denmark the assurances of its highest consideration.
